SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures:

The symptoms resulting from intoxication can appear after exposure, therefore, in case of doubt, seek medical attention for direct exposure to the chemical product or persistent discomfort, showing the SDS of this product.

By inhalation:

SECTION 5: FIREFIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Extinguishing media:

Product is non-flammable under normal conditions of storage, manipulation and use, containing flammable substances.
